

SING OUT!

This great photo of the Mountain View Rackensack Folklore Society appeared on the front and back covers of the April-May 1966 issue of "Sing Out!" - a folksong magazine begun in 1950 by Pete Seeger and Irwin Silber. Published bi-monthly, it contained articles about folk musicians, festivals, reviews of recordings, and other subjects related to folk music and the oral tradition, as well as lyrics and music for 12 to in every issue. songs Publication ceased in 2014.



This issue includes an article by "Jimmie" (his spelling) Driftwood entitled "The Arkansas Folk Festival, Revival at the Grass Roots." The event is described as the 4th annual festival, featuring talented Ozark musicians whose family members go back many generations. Driftwood states "Isolation has kept this 'patch of Ozarkia' rich in British ballads and early American folksongs. The Festival concerts will feature ballad singers, fiddlers, banjo frailers, guitar strummers, tunes from the dulcimer and gourd, and old-time square dances as well as spontaneous jig dancers." He offers help and advice for communities who want to start their own folk music festival and concludes with: "Play your music straight and keep it clean...We have no amplified instruments or drums. We try to play like our forefathers."


