Rackensack Monthly Meetings - New Location for 2024!

The Officers of the Rackensack Folklore Society, Pulaski County are very pleased to announce that beginning January 1, 2024, our monthly Rackensack meetings will be held on the first Monday of each month, at the Historic Cox Building at 120 Rivermarket Avenue, Little Rock. The parking lot and entrance to the building is accessible at 100 Rock Street, on the campus of the Main Library (CALS-Central Arkansas Library System). We are extremely grateful to CALS for their support and vision for the future of Rackensack. We are excited to return to the downtown Little Rock area, where Rackensack Pulaski County was birthed 60 years ago this year, through the vision of George Fisher and the encouragement of his friend, and founder of the parent chapter of Rackensack in Mountain View, Jimmy Driftwood.

This extraordinary offer from CALS to host our meetings at the Cox Building will allow Rackensack to be re-connected to the vibrant arts community in Central Arkansas. The space provides us with a beautiful and historic setting for our music and mission to continue and grow, and at no cost to Rackensack.

Thirty-three of our regular musicians and about 15 listeners visited the building during our two trial runs on September 14th, and October 19th. The Officers solicited feedback from all of the attendees. There was much excitement about the venue and quality of sound during our music presentations.

We are especially grateful to the Parks and Recreation Department of the City of Maumelle for renting us the space at the Community Center at a discounted rate, which provided us with a temporary home for 2 ½ years, during the renovation of the Arkansas Museum of Fine Arts, where Rackensack met for 56 years! We plan to continue the outdoor concerts on the Lake when weather and scheduling permit. We will continue to meet at the Community Center through the end of 2023.

We know that relocating our monthly meeting place is challenging and we encourage everyone to contact us if there are questions or concerns. If you need any help with directions, please let us know. We hope you will come and be a part of this new chapter of Rackensack Folklore Society, Pulaski County!
